- Candidates arriving late will be allowed a 2-minute introduction. Moderators have discretion on any further participation.

 Neighborhood Association President, Jeanette Swenson, welcomed participants and outlined the forum format and housekeeping items.

10:15 - 11:15 City Council District 4 Candidates present for the forum - 60:00 min

- Candidates answered questions presented by WPNA president, Jeanette Swenson, and discussed topics such as housing, public safety, transportation, and community engagement:
 - Monica Guzmán: monicaford4.com: Focused on affordable housing, advocating for public transportation improvements, including a

- **neighborhood circulator**, and promoting **community-driven solutions** for reentry and housing.
- <u>Louis Herring: louisherrin.com</u>: Emphasized citywide audits to ensure efficient use of funds, and the need to preserve neighborhoods while developing, and expanding bus systems to better serve residents.
- José "Chito" Vela: chitovela.com: Highlighted the need for affordable housing, increased public safety measures, especially around mental health crisis response, and the importance of building sidewalks and bike lanes to address mobility issues.

11:25 - 12:25 | Mayoral Candidates present for the forum - 60:00 min

- Candidates answered questions presented by WPNA president and shared their vision for the city, touching on sustainability, infrastructure, and homelessness:
 - Jeffery L. Bowen: https://www.jeffbowenforaustinmayor.com/: Called for a citywide audit to assess resource allocation, proposed creative solutions for homelessness, and raised concerns about environmental issues like water conservation and the urban heat island effect.
 - <u>Doug Greco:</u> <u>grecoforaustin.com</u>: Stressed the need for <u>affordable</u> housing, protecting the rights of the <u>middle class</u>, and ensuring <u>public</u> transit supports a sustainable future. He also focused on preserving <u>small</u> local businesses.
 - <u>Carmen D. Llanes Pulido:</u> <u>carmen4mayor.com</u>: Focused on water conservation, preventing displacement by <u>preserving affordable housing</u>, and <u>listening to community voices</u> on key issues like infrastructure.
 - <u>Kathie Tovo:</u> <u>kathieforaustin.com:</u> Highlighted her experience on the city council, with a focus on <u>climate action</u>, expanding <u>affordable housing</u>, and implementing policies to support <u>small businesses</u>, like the <u>Family Business Loan Program</u>.
